

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Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport.

Possible uses for the funding might include for 2015-2016:

- Supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs- after school clubs.
- Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sports coaches.
- Creating sustainable PE program.
- Running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games.
- Providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs (use of school for parents clubs)
- Using professional sport facilities and professional coaching in to allow outdoor adventure sports to take place.
- Creating new sport curriculum through other sports for example sailing center and other sports.
- Support travel for schools sports teams.
- Create a community sport training program.
- Aiming for schools game mark and aiming Kite Quality Mark
- Promoting local sporting actives and companies.

This year, our school has received two payments totalling £8910: a payment of £5198 was collected in November followed by £3712 in April. The following summary provides further information on how this money has been spent at Corngreaves Academy.

Purchase of scheme of work to support short/medium planning by teachers and HLTAs delivering P.E across the school.	£1000	Monitoring has shown improvements in the quality of medium term plans submitted by teachers. As a result, there is clear progression of skills across year groups. During observed lessons, a clear lesson structure could be seen. This allowed children to practise skills before putting them into contexts and clear progress could be seen within lessons. HLTAs can be quoted as feeling more confident in preparing PE lessons. This has resulted in a more passionate and engaging delivery for the children.	Continue to use this scheme of work as a planning tool to support the creation of long and medium term plans. Subject leader to monitor planning in order to ensure appropriate coverage of the National Curriculum. In order to deliver of some of these ideas, a stock audit needs to be completed alongside an order for required equipment. Funding for 2016/17 to be used for this purpose.
Purchase of PE equipment.	£1500	Equipment purchased for Yoga and Cricket. Children have been able to access and take part in such activities more appropriately using the correct equipment.	An audit needs to take place to ensure that school has the correct equipment to ensure that all activities/sports can be delivered to this standard.
Subsidisation of activities delivered by the Albion Foundation during breakfast and afterschool clubs.	£3792	Children attending breakfast club are able to take part in a range of games after their breakfast. As a result, children are active for longer periods during the day. It has also been noted that children are more awake and alert at the start of their school day. A range of active afterschool clubs are offered to children. More children are able to attend as they are more affordable and accessible to parents.	Next academic year, activities will be delivered by support staff during breakfast club. Subsidised afterschool clubs continued to be offered to ensure activities can be accessed by all.

		Teaching assistants have been able to observe the practise of Albion Foundation staff during such sessions. This has developed our own teaching assistants and had improved their knowledge of using games and activities to get children active.	
Hire of swimming pool/swimming lessons for Year 3 and 4 children.	Approx. £1500.	Year 3 and 4 children have been swimming weekly for this academic year. As a result, a high percentage of children are working towards the expected standard of swimming by the end of Key Stage Two as outlined in the National Curriculum.	After discussion with parents, this funding has been reviewed and it has been decided that next academic year, Year 4 children will just swim weekly in the Summer Term.
Service of outdoor climbing equipment both in the Early Years outdorr area and the main playground	Approx £500	Improved equipment for children to use at lunchtimes so that they can engage in physical learning opportunities	Increased participation in physical learning opportunities all year groups at lunchtimes and break times daily. Continual access for EYFS to outdoor climbing equipment.
